Inspired by the artists you've seen at today's event? You too can have a go at capturing Padiham and its people!

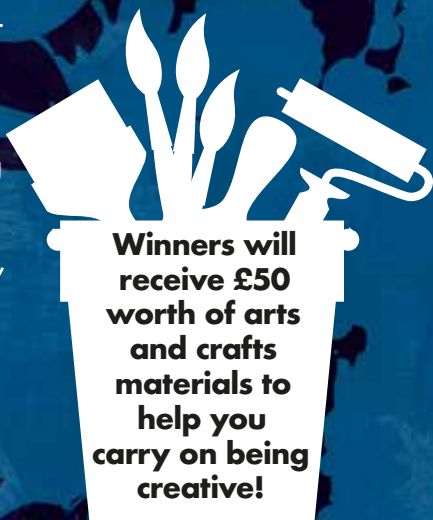

# Crafting the Future

We're investing in local heritage through the Padiham Townscape Heritage Project, *Crafting the Future*, which has been recently launched. The Project aims to repair and restore historic buildings, improve public spaces, provide local people with training in traditional building skills and develop activities to engage people to learn about and enjoy the town's heritage.

The project is focused on a compact area within the town centre and includes proposals for the restoration of a number of historic buildings located on 'the hill' through reinstatement of traditional features including windows, doors and shopfronts. The project is supported by Heritage Lottery Funding of £1.4 million and delivered in partnership with Burnley Borough Council.

The Townscape Heritage programme is pleased to support Painting Padiham in capturing the town's much loved heritage and community through art. This is part of a series of wider community activities throughout the borough which will run during the lifetime of the project.

## WATCH LIVE
